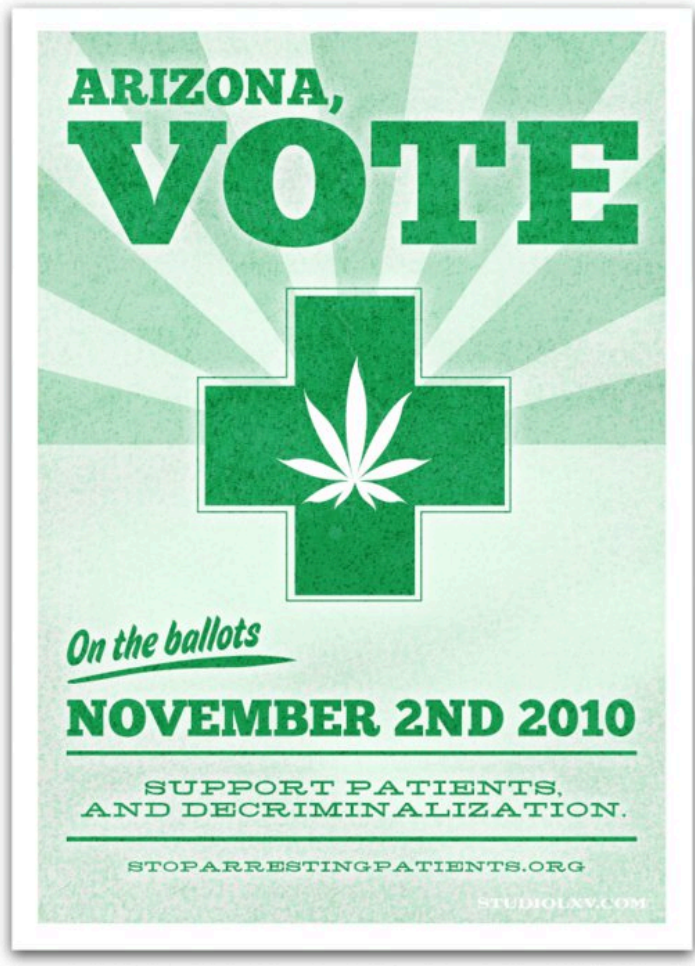


AZ4NORML MINUTES

Tucson Folk Festival – Our costs are \$100.00. May 1 & May 2 and it's a fun event and we're well received. Venue for this event is Presidio Park (downtown, Tucson). Even if you can only participate part-time that works.

WorldWide Marijuana March – April 20.

1999 Dana Beal set up the march. Our March is 4/20 (to beat the heat) with the rest of the world doing the march on consecutive weekends in May (May 1 and May 8). On the back of the poster

is a complete schedule of all cities. Tucson has been participating since 1999. The March starts at Broadway/Plumer and will move West on Broadway and pick-up at the corner of Broadway/Campbell. The March end site is Cheba Hut with food specials and a live band. We'll be building on the great success from last year and the University of Arizona students come in droves to Cheba Hut on 4/20.

Earth Day – April 17th. We'll do a table and show off all kinds of hemp products. You can sign up on the volunteer board located on our info table.

Hemp Committee – join the Hemp Committee, lots of work to do. Every Tuesday from 1:00 – 4:30 we'll be working on getting lots of crafts done before the March.

2010 NORML Conference. This year it will be in Portland. The conference will include growers, sellers and you'll get to tour dispensaries. The conference is the same time as Hemp Stalk.

Medical Marijuana Initiative. Run by MPP and the Arizona Medical Marijuana Policy Project has been collecting signatures. All the signatures have been collected and they are going through a validity check before they are submitted to the Arizona Secretary of State. We will now be registering people to vote and starting our advocacy. This is a statewide initiative and California will have their Tax & Regulate initiative on the ballot the same day. Approximately 252,000 signatures were turned in as needed. Early June we will hear whether we made the ballot or not.
